OPERATIONAL GUIDELINE FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME ON SEASONAL FODDER DEMONSTRATION PROGRAMME IN THE SELECTED FARMERS FIELD DURING KHARIF/ LATE KHARIF 2021-22

UNDER STATE SECTOR SCHEME

"TRAINING & DEMONSTRATION IN FODDER CULTIVATION AND PASTURE DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING OF DEPARTMENTAL FODDER FARMS OF ODISHA".

DIRECTORATE OF ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND VETERINARY SERVICES, ODISHA, MANGALABAG, CUTTACK.

This guideline is being issued for implementation of programme on seasonal fodder minikit demonstration programme during kharif/late kharif 2021-22 under State sector scheme – "Training & Demonstration in Fodder Cultivation and Pasture Development and Strengthening of Departmental Fodder Farms of Odisha".

One minikit comprises of Maize (1 packet of 3 kg. seed) and Cowpea (1 packet of 1 kg. Seed) which is usually meant for fodder crop cultivation (Cereal & Legume component) over 0.25 Acre. The seed will be procured and supplied to the District HQ points through Central/ State Govt. approved seed supplying agencies as per the district wise target enclosed in this guideline.

Programme details of Seasonal fodder mini kit demonstration programme during 2021-22

It has been approved in the Annual Action Plan to take up the minikit demonstration programme in the entire State covering 30 districts.

- I. During Kharif / late kharif 2021-22, 15000 Nos. of minikits are to be supplied to the selected beneficiaries in the district.
- II. The minikits procured through Central/ State Govt. approved seed supplying agencies to be supplied to the dairy farmers of each block selected by the block level committee comprising of BVO, VAS/Addl VAS, Local Para vets, Milk union representative & PRI members duly approved by the CDVO of the concerned District.
- **III.** One farmer can be provided at least one minikit depending upon the area of the land. One farmer can be assisted up to 20 minikits covering a maximum area of 5 Acres.

Use of Key criteria for the Mini kit demonstration programme and the justification.

 Towards Sustainable development goal 	Small holder farmers can develop green fodder by cultivating fodder in a small piece of land. Once the experience if gained can be extended to the area as per their capacity.
 Towards Increasing farmers income and enhancing income activities 	Both Kharif and Late Kharif are two seasons when farmers become bound to stall feed their livestock as the field are occupied with grain crops or cash crops. Farmers have to buy green fodder or dry fodder which is expensive. By cultivating seasonal fodder they are able to mitigate the green fodder scarcity to a large extent.
Towards Empowering women	Seasonal fodder are easy to harvest for which women farmers who go to field bunds or Common Property Resource (CPR) to avail green fodder are facilitated with ease of harvest.
• Towards Skill development	During Kharif and late kharif fodder cultivation require a good skill for adopting different agronomic practice.
Towards Enhancing participation of other vulnerable population	Vulnerable population not having enough land can take up fodder cultivation in a small area measuring 25 cents.

Operational guideline for the programme in the Farmers field

- Each Fodder seed minikit cereal and legume component will be supplied to the farmer free of cost for cultivation of seasonal fodder crop.
- During selection of beneficiary MPCS members, Fodder Cooperative members, SHG/ NMPS/ CAE/ DEDS/ MKUY/ to be selected on priority basis and Goshala/ Animal Shelter House can also be included. During selection SC, ST and Women farmers can also be given preference for selection of beneficiary.
- The beneficiary selected in the district should be communicated to the Directorate (both hard & soft copy) as per the proforma enclosed.
- Each beneficiary may be provided with at least one no. of minikit to maximum of 20 nos. of minikits for fodder cultivation over 0.25 Ac to 5.00 Ac as each kit covers an area of 0.25 Ac.
- The fodder cultivation in farmers' field should be Geo-tagged for documentation.
 The success stories along with Geo-Tagged Photos are to be submitted to the
 Directorate. The achievement is to be incorporated in the MPR (ANNEXURE I).
- At least 5 No of crop cuttings per variety over 1sq meter area can be taken from the farmers' field to calculate the average green fodder yield over 1 Ac area.
- Each beneficiary must be provided with leaflet in 'Odia' on methodology of seasonal fodder cultivation.
- For timely distribution of the minikits at the farmers door step within the district,
 Preparation of leaflet on package of practices of seasonal fodder crops and
 documentation etc requisite funds @ Rs 15/- per minikit will be allotted shortly.

Procurement and distribution Plan of Fodder minikits:

- 1. The Fodder seed minikits will be supplied to respective district headquarters from the Directorate through Central/ State Govt. approved seed supplying agencies.
- 2. From District Headquarter the minikits are to be supplied to the farmers door step through the concerned BVOs for which Rs 15/- per Minikit will be allocated to the concerned CDVOs for logistic charges towards internal distribution within the district, preparation of leaflet on package of practices of seasonal fodder crops & documentation charges etc.
